## Maynard Children's Hospital Implementation Update

Book Harvest's Books from Birth program at Maynard Children's Hospital launched on October 1, 2024. By December 31, 2024, a total of 929 families with newborns had participated in Books from Birth.



#### 🙎 🔼 Reach

Among the **929 participating families**, roughly one-third had babies in the NICU, highlighting the program's ability to support families during challenging medical situations.

The remaining two-thirds of participants received the literacy resources directly on the birthing floor.



### **Statewide Impact**

Participating families are from **33 counties** across North Carolina. The participation of families from both urban and rural communities underscores the program's scalability and adaptability.



## **Implementation Blueprint**

A detailed and actionable guide has been created for other hospitals interested in replicating the program.

The blueprint includes step-by-step processes for integrating the program into hospital workflows, training staff, and engaging families effectively.

Due to the program's demonstrated success, numerous hospitals in North Carolina and across the United States have expressed interest in adopting the program.
